

The Presbyterian Annual Synod

Proceedings at the Opening in New Westminster Last Week.

Large Attendance and a Great Deal of Enthusiasm Developed.

New Westminster, June 5.—The synod met again in the evening at 8 o'clock.

Rev. Joseph McCoy, M. A., Victoria, made a request on behalf of the Ladies College, Victoria, that the synod should make a calendar and express approval thereof, commending the college to the people under its support.

Dr. Herdman presented the report on home missions and evangelization. Last year the number of mission stations in the synod was 57. There are now 104 such stations, 12 in the Province of B. C., 17 in the Province of Alberta, and 85 in the Province of Saskatchewan.
