A MILLION DOLLAR FIRE.

THE EXPOSITION BUILDING AT PITTSBURG BURNED.

All the exhibits destroyed—The Origin of the Fire a Mystery—It Spreads With Great Rapidity.

PITTSBURG, Pa., Oct. 3.—About two this morning the Exposition building caught fire, and in fifty minutes the entire building, machinery and floor halls were in ashes. The fire was discovered in the engine room of the machinery department, and not to frighten the citizens a still alarm was sent in. In this way the flames got beyond control, and before the department reached the grounds the building was almost entirely destroyed.

Second dispatch: The magnificent buildings of the Pittsburgh exposition on the North bank of the Allegheny were totally destroyed, together with the almost entire contents of the building. In less than ten minutes the buildings were in fire from end to end. When the department arrived the flames were below control. Nothing was saved, and the firemen turned their attention to the adjacent property, many residences in South avenue being in flames. By hard work they saved all these. Repeated alarms sound around almost the entire population of the two cities. Seventy-five to one hundred thousand persons witnessed the conflagration.

The origin of the fire is uncertain. The loss will probably aggregate a million. The buildings were valued at \$1,000,000; insurance \$400,000. The exhibitors' loss is about \$300,000. An irreparable loss was occasioned by the destruction of the machinery department. Had the conflagration occurred last night at 9 o'clock the loss of life would have been appalling. The main building was 600 feet long by 150 wide; the machinery hall 400 long by 150 wide. The others were smaller.

It is reported that Prof. Warner, the balloonist, and Assistant Edward Williams were on the ground when the explosion occurred from the careless handling of benzine.
