

A Member from Hamilton: Gentlemen, it appears to us that you want to make the stall trade believe that you do not want all these big profits which you have been received.

T. Kinnear: You were not all talking this way two years ago.

H. P. Eckardt: Gentlemen, I suppose this is the result of Mr. Lumbers' circulars.
