Why, then, should Canada not compete in foreign markets with the United States in this industry? There is nothing in the world except our own lack of enterprise, to prevent our getting our fair share of the trade that is now handled by the United States, Australia and other countries.

The establishment of a dead meat business in Canada is thoroughly consistent with the policy that the Government has all along endeavored to see carried out to the fullest extent.

Our people are encouraged, not only to grow the best fruits and vegetables, but to preserve and can them and put them in such a shape that they can be handled, not in Canada alone, but over the whole world.

The actual carrying out of this policy is well seen in the fruit business in the Toronto district. The fruit industry in the Niagara Peninsula has increased from \$10,000,000 ten years ago to \$1,000,000 this year.
