

YACHTSMEN FOR GREAT SODAS.

Meeting of 75 Yachts and 600 Sailors—Boats Expected to Compete—Chaos of the Craft.

That the week of July 4th will be the greatest week in the history of fresh water yachting on one who knows of the plans of the Lake Yachting Association for its rendezvous at Great Soda Bay will deny, says The Rochester Herald, and continues:

For the past month the Committee of Arrangements has been busy arranging the details of the most secured for the Wayne County Yacht Club since the meeting at Toronto.

There will be four days of racing during the week, the local club having a cruising race to the west on the Monday previous to the opening of the association rendezvous.

The clubs comprising the membership of the association are: Queen's Yacht Club, Toronto; Yacht Club, Belleville; Oswego Yacht Club, Oswego; Queen City Yacht Club, Toronto; Rochester Yacht Club, Charlotte; Royal Canadian Yacht Club, Toronto; Royal Hamilton Yacht Club, Hamilton; Victoria Yacht Club, Hamilton.

Entries for all the races must be made with the secretary of the club to which yachts intending to compete belong and not later than Saturday, June 23. Such secretaries will then send the entries to the association officer, James Pilow, of this city, by whom all entries must be received not later than Monday, June 25. A measurer's certificate must accompany each entry.

In all probability there will be 500 yachtsmen in Great Soda Bay looking for a chance to show out their skill in making new records for their craft. A great effort has been made by the individual clubs to have every yacht in commission down at the rendezvous.

In the first class of boats it is expected that the following yachts will compete: Veda, Toronto, Commodore A. B. Rowell; Oriole, Toronto, George Gooderham; and Capt. Dick Tugler's sailing master, Allison, Toronto, Capt. Robert Miles; North, Belleville, John Bell; and Capt. John Black sailing master.

In the 40-foot class the following are expected: Pappos, Commodore John T. Mott; Dewey, Commodore, Toronto, Capt. G. A. B. Brown; Hamilton, Capt. James Hendrie, and White Wings, also from Hamilton.

While it is not known yet whether Capt. Norman B. Dick's fast Toronto cutter will be entered in the 40-foot class, Capt. Allen Ames' Tama of Oswego, Capt. Stewart Malloch's Dinah of Hamilton, and Capt. Mercat's Aggie of Oakville are the yachts expected to start in the 40-foot class.

In the 35-foot class Captain George Creighton's Ariel, Captain W. J. Priestard's Hippie and the Vision of Cobourg are the yachts which will make the liveliest time for each other.
