This Little Bird Has A Great Capacity

Madison, Ois., Oct. 30.-Results of a

scientific investigation of the capacity of birds to destroy insects were announced to-day at the University of Wisconsin by A. R. Cahn, assistant in the zoological laboratory.

A Virginia wren, a marsh bird of half

A virginia wren, a marsa bird of nair a pound weight, showed the remarkable ability of devouring pests. In one day the bird ate 144 amphophids, 12 grass-hoppers, 12 meal worms, three water bugs, one water scorpion three inches long, two small sunfish, one stickleback, a sort of fish 2½ inches long, one caterpillar and 15 flies.

The second day, in addition to the menu of the day before, it ate five live hornets, one crawfish two inches long, one frog 1½ inches long, and one grass

one riog 172 inches long, and one glass snake eight inches long.

The snake caused the bird some worry but after the bird tried eight times to swallow the snake alive it finally killed the reptile and gulped it down.

In the two days the bird ate more than its own weight.

The Call For Beef

From a tabular statement submitted by a speaker at the Chicago Convention of American Packers it appeared that in eleven of the principal agricultural nations of the world there had been an average increase in population of 20.5 per cent and of cattle a fraction more than 8 per cent, during a period representing approximately ten years. The only country showing a larger proportionate increase in cattle was Australia, where the population increased 18 per cent. and cattle 40 per cent. Canada showed a relative increase of 35 and 20 per cent. respectively. Argentina was unchanged. The United States with an increase of 20 per cent. in population and a decrease of 30 per cent. in cattle, while Brazil increased 20 per cent. in population and had the same percentage of decrease in cattle. These figures make it plain that relief cannot permanently come from changes in the direction of meat shipments from the countries that have a surplus to export.

Hope of lower prices can only come from a better system of stock raising. A movement in that direction has already begun in the western states of the Union and in the central and eastern states long stretches of land are equally available for pastural purposes. United States Department of Agriculture is bringing its attention to this side of the problem, and one of its proposals is to free the small farmer from dependence on the big packing houses by the establishment of abattoirs in centres all over the country, the encouragement of cattle raising on small holdings and co-operative live stock associations. Legislation to forward this object is expected to pass congress at its regular session. Mr. Galloway, assistant secretary to the department, has stated that in his estimation the real solution is the establishment of abattoirs in the smaller cities, They have hitherto been discouraged by the large meat-packers.
