A French steamer has gone to Cayenne to take Dreyfus home to France, for his new trial.

Dr. Talmage has retired from the pastorate of the leading Presbyterian Church in Washington.

A new direct steamship service will be inaugurated at an early date between Paris and New York.

The Jamaica Government will appoint an agent at Ottawa to promote trade relations between Jamaica and Canada.

Twelve millions dollars is the sum paid annually in Great Britain for cablegrams to the United States.

The legislature of Massachusetts has voted more than three to one against the abolition of capital punishment.

Recent heavy frosts have done a great deal of damage to fruit and vegetable throughout some of the most fertile districts of England.

It is reported that the American navy, possibly, the passage of the government's contribution bill in the Canadian House of Commons.

Vaccination's Protection.

The annual report of the Montreal Board of Health for 1908 includes a special report on the smallpox epidemic which had made on the last smallpox outbreak in Montreal, extending from July 9, 1897, to Feb. 12, 1902. It states that the number of smallpox in the city during 1908, 14 of the patients dying and 13 being disfigured. Of the patients who died, 10 of them had been previously vaccinated, and only one of the other thirteen; so that out of the 14 deaths, 13 had been vaccinated. The disease only perhaps had been vaccinated.
