The Library Committee have little to report at the present meeting. Much time has been taken up in collecting together the parts of the various volumes of exchanges which have for some time been accumulating in the library. These have been arranged and put into the hands of the binder to the number of 248 volumes. the Council having voted \$150 for binding. These books, it is expected, will be placed on the Library shelves before the next meeting of the Society. Many valuable works which were lying about in the closets under the library cases will be found among them, as also useful works in the French and German languages. Your Committee have also obtained in exchange for duplicates, by permission of the Council, twelve volumes of Popular Science Monthly, of recent date.
