A RECEPTION was tendered to Mgr. Sault by the Catholic laymen of St. Paul at the Hotel Ryan last Friday evening. About 2,000 persons received an introduction to the distinguished Archbishop.

The daily average number of patients treated in the general hospital for last week was eighty-two, of which forty-nine were males and thirty-three females. Twenty-nine out patients were also treated during the week.

At St. Mary's at High Mass on Sunday last Rev. Father McCarthy, O.M.I. in the course of his sermon paid a touching tribute to the life of the late Rev. Father Maisonneuve as a missionary in the far west.

The convention called by the Farmers Alliance to discuss the question of wages for farm hands during harvest and threshing time met at Grand Forks, N. D., last Saturday and adopted a resolution unanimously recommending that \$2 per day be paid this season.

TWENTY years ago a Toronto man failed owing \$556 to Mr. G. Offord, a Kingston boot and shoe merchant. The other day Mr. Offord received \$50 in part payment of the debt. Perhaps some of our readers may be able to draw a little hope from this occurrence.

THE C. P. R. land sales for July amounted to 15,000 acres. Compared with past years this is regarded as favorable, although last July the sales were exceptional and exceeded this month's. Since the first of the year the land department have disposed of 80,000 acres.

THE Rev. Edwin R. Russell, Episcopal minister of New York, has become a Catholic. His conversion is said to be largely due to another convert, the young Jesuit, Father Henry Van Rensselaer. He was received very quietly into the Church by Archbishop Corrigan a little more than a month ago.

Work has been commenced on the new \$40,000 addition to the St. Boniface hospital and it is expected that the building will be completed by Nov. 1, as it is needed as soon as possible. The size of the addition is 100x57 feet. One of the valuable features of the hospital will be the operating room which will run along one side of the hospital and is to be 67x33, making it one of the most complete on the continent.

A MONTREAL despatch to the "Free Press" says: Senator Bernier, of Manitoba, has written to the secretary of the recent St. Jean Baptiste National congress, protesting against the resolution adopted after his departure, declaring in favor of the admission of Protestants into membership in the St. Jean Baptiste society. He says this act does away with the traditions of our race in Canada, and I cannot give my support to this new form of Canadian patriotism. I wish not only to discharge myself from responsibility of this act of the congress, but to express the hope that it will not be sanctioned by our various national societies.

THE Rev. Father Lacombe, during his recent visit to the east, arranged with a number of Catholic colleges to take charge of and adopt a certain number of

boys from the Northwest, to be chosen by the Rev. Father himself. Twelve colleges promised their share, consequently twelve boys will be picked out and sent to their new homes. They will probably be composed entirely of Indians and half-breeds, and will assemble in Regina about the 20th of this month, and from there be conducted east under the charge of a priest. Only those who show exceptional capacity will be chosen, and their parents' permission will in such case be obtained giving them to the Church, and provided they turn out straight, they will be educated for the priesthood.—MacLeod Gazette.

Of Interest to Catholics.

The supreme court of Massachusetts has rendered a decision recently which gives great satisfaction to Catholics. The decision affirms the right of Catholic parents to send their children to Catholic schools, the only test being to show by actual examination that the child has received the instruction required by law. In New York city, where the Catholic schoolboys carry off most of the West Point and Annapolis cadetships under competitive examination, this test would not be considered severe.

THE PICNIC

Change of Date—From Thursday, 17th to Saturday, the 19th inst.

The picnic which is to be held at the Winnipeg Exhibition grounds in aid of the building fund of the church of the Immaculate Conception will take place on Saturday, the 19th, inst., instead of Thursday, the 17th, as announced in our issue of last week. This change has been made in deference to the request of a large number who desire to attend the picnic but could not conveniently do so if held on the date originally intended, owing to the fact that another big picnic has been arranged for the 17th, and also owing to the order which has recently gone into effect closing the C. P. R. shops on Saturdays. The committee in charge of the arrangements for the picnic are all hard at work, holding numerous meetings and making most extensive preparations to assure a day's pleasure to those who attend.

A MISSION

At the Church of the Immaculate Conception.

A mission was opened at the church of the Immaculate Conception on Sunday evening by the Rev. Father Godtz, a Redemptorist father from Montreal. The church was well filled, a much larger congregation than usual at the half past ten mass being present. When he ascended into the pulpit the missionary father briefly laid down the rules he intended to adopt for the regulation of the mission. He stated that as he wished as much as possible to make it a mission for all the people of the parish he intended to preach the sermon throughout the retreat in the different languages spoken by the bulk of the parishioners. On Sunday morning therefore he briefly spoke in German and then preached a most impressive sermon in English on the necessity of devoting every moment of time to preparation for eternity. On Sunday afternoon there was a special service for the Germans who attended in considerable numbers. Hymns were sung in their mother language, and the beads recited. Father Godtz then preached, and this was followed by Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. On Sunday evening after recitation of the beads a short sermon was first given in French followed by a discourse in English in which the preacher pictured in thrilling language the enormity of moral sin, and appealed to his hearers to from that moment declare an undying warfare against it. Prayers were said for the conversion of all sinners in the parish. During the week the masses will be at 5.30 and at 9 o'clock. All those who have to go to work early are expected to attend the first mass, and those who can do so should make it a point to be present at the 9 o'clock mass at which an instruction will be given. On Monday afternoon the children of the parish who have not made their first communion were all assembled in the church and addressed by the Reverend missionary, and the following day those who have made their first communion within the last three years had a special service. Each evening at 7.30 the beads are recited followed by an instruction in English, and a short instruction either in German or French. As the mission is to last only one week confessions will be heard on Wednesday and Thursday for married people, and on Friday and Saturday for others.

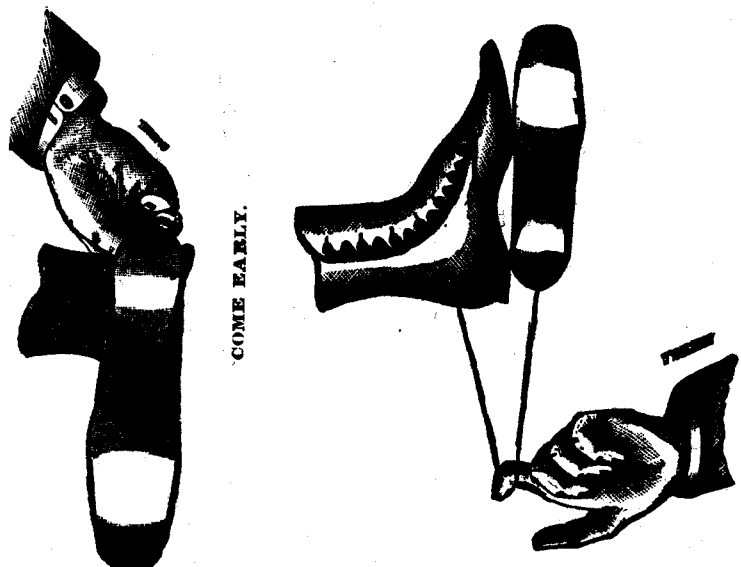
