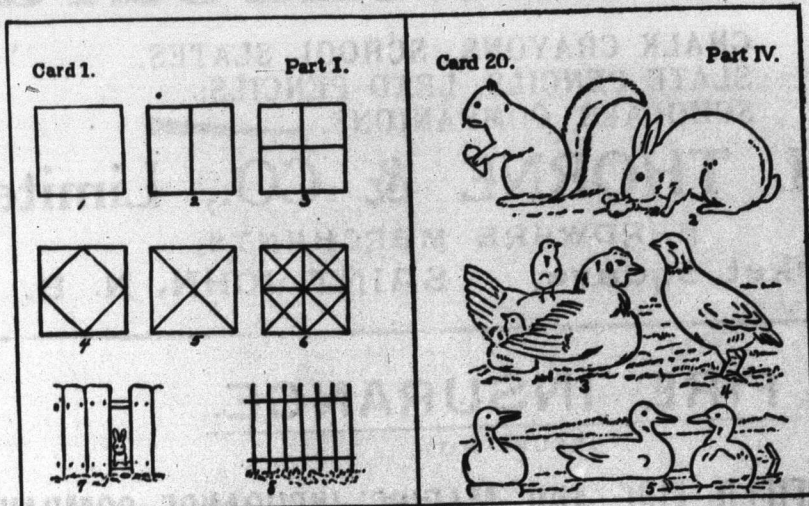

## OFFICIAL NOTICE.

REGULATIONS OF BOARD OF EDUCATION.

Any candidate for Grammar School Class, Class I or Class II, who shall have made the required average on the subjects required for such Class, but who shall have been debarred from receiving such class of license by reason of his marks in not more than two subjects having fallen below the minimum requirement, such candidate may at any subsequent annual examination for teachers' license

be permitted to undergo examination in the subjects in which the minimum requirement was not reached, provided this provision shall not apply to more than two subjects or papers.

The minimum requirement for the supplemental subjects will be 50 per cent. in each subject.

The provisions of Reg. 31, 7, with respect to Drawing are hereby cancelled.
