

75. The Government of Ghana agrees that married quarters provided under this Article will be made available at the standard rents applicable to members of the Armed Forces of Ghana. Rents payable under this Article are deemed to include the cost of electricity, water, gas and conservancy.

76. The Government of Ghana agrees to provide married unaccompanied or single members with quarters at its expense.

Article XXVII (Dangerously Ill Personnel)

77. When a member is placed on the dangerously ill list and the medical officer attending him so recommends, the Government of Ghana agrees to pay the full cost of return air transportation between the port of embarkation in Canada and the member's station in Ghana of one of his near relatives, other than his wife if accompanied, or of his wife if married and unaccompanied. A near relative under this Article will normally be considered to be the member's father or mother.

Article XXVIII (Education)

78. The Government of Ghana agrees to provide free education for children aged five to eleven years inclusive who accompany a member to Ghana.

79. The Government of Ghana agrees to provide an education allowance as prescribed for Canadian Forces personnel serving abroad in respect of members' other children educated inside or outside Ghana.

Article XXIX (Servants)

80. The Government of Ghana agrees to provide servants for all members in accordance with the regulations of the Armed Forces of Ghana in effect at the time.

Article XXX (Withdrawal of Personnel and Termination of Employment)

81. For the purposes of this Article, "family" has the same meaning as in paragraph 67.

82. If a member neglects or refuses or, for any disciplinary reason, becomes unable to perform his duties or misconducts himself, the Government of Ghana, on the advice of the Canadian Armed Forces Liaison Officer, may terminate his service with the Armed Forces of Ghana. All advantages and concessions granted to him as a member shall, with effect from the date of termination of his service, be subject to the discretion of the Government of Ghana acting on the advice of the Canadian Armed Forces Liaison Officer. The Government of Ghana will be responsible for arranging free passages to Canada for the member and his family.

83. If a member is found to be physically, temperamentally or otherwise unsuitable and is, as a result, returned to Canada, free passages to Canada for himself and his family, if in Ghana, will be arranged by Ghana and advantages and concessions will be granted by Ghana in proportion to the length of his tour of residential service.

84. In the event of the death of a member while serving with the Armed Forces of Ghana, his family, if in Ghana, will be provided by Ghana with free passage to Canada. Advantages and concessions will be granted by Ghana in proportion to the length of the member's tour of residential service. Expenses
