Royal Go-Declaration

152. The Royal Government of Laos in its unilateral Vernment declaration made on 20th July, 1954, with reference to Declaration of the Geneva Powers, Article 3 of the Final Declaration of the Geneva Powers, declared "itself resolved to take the necessary measures to intergrate all citizens, without discrimination, into the national community and to guarantee them the enjoyment of the might and for which the Constitution of of the rights and freedoms for which the Constitution of the Kingdom provides; affirms that all Laotian citizens the Kingdom provides; affirms that all Laborates in may freely participate as electors or candidates in May freely participate as electors. As regards the two general elections by secret ballot".
