

CANADIAN EXPORTS TO THE FEDERATION HAVE GROWN FROM \$1.6 MILLION IN 1959, TO \$3.9 MILLION IN 1954, TO \$4.7 MILLION IN 1956 AND CONTINUED TO EXPAND IN 1957. DURING THE FIRST ELEVEN MONTHS OF 1957 CANADA'S EXPORTS TO THE FEDERATION AMOUNTED TO \$4.5 MILLION AS AGAINST \$4.2 MILLION IN THE CORRESPONDING PERIOD IN 1956.

PRINCIPAL CANADIAN EXPORTS TO THE FEDERATION ARE WHEAT, LUMBER, PAPER, MINING MACHINERY, MOTOR VEHICLES AND CHEMICALS.

IN 1956 IMPORTS FROM THE FEDERATION INTO CANADA AMOUNTED TO \$720,000. DURING THE FIRST TEN MONTHS OF 1957 CANADIAN IMPORTS WERE \$1 MILLION AGAINST \$528,000 IN THE CORRESPONDING TEN-MONTH PERIOD IN 1956. THE PRINCIPAL PRODUCTS IMPORTED ARE MINERALS, INCLUDING FERRO-ALLOY, CHROME ORE AND CRUDE ASBESTOS.
