By unanimous consent, it was ordered,—(1) That the hour for Private Members' Business this day be suspended; and

(2) That this House adjourn this day at 6.00 o'clock p.m.

Mr. Davis for Mr. Sharp, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid upon the Table,—Copy of the text of the Joint Canada-U.S.A. reference concerning Point Roberts to the International Joint Commission. (English and French).—Sessional Paper No. 283-6/37.

By unanimous consent, on motion of Mr. Forget, seconded by Mr. Lessard (LaSalle), it was ordered,—That the petition of Central-Del Rio Oils Limited, filed after the time limit under Standing Order 90, be referred to the Standing Committee on Miscellaneous Private Bills and Standing Orders together with the Third Report of the Clerk of Petitions thereon presented to the House on Friday, April 2, 1971, for any recommendations the Committee deems advisable.

By unanimous consent, on motion of Mr. Forget, seconded by Mr. Lessard (LaSalle), it was ordered,—That the petition of Mic Mac Oils (1963) Ltd., filed after the time limit under Standing Order 90, be referred to the Standing Committee on Miscellaneous Private Bills and Standing Orders together with the Third Report of the Clerk of Petitions thereon presented to the House on Friday, April 2, 1971, for any recommendations the Committee deems advisable.

The House resumed debate on the motion of Mr. Chrétien, seconded by Mr. Macdonald (Rosedale),—That Bill C-187, An Act respecting minerals in the Yukon Territory be now read a second time and referred to the Standing Committee on Indian Affairs and Northern Development.

And on the motion of Mr. Nielsen, seconded by Mr. Aiken, in amendment thereto,—That all the words after "That" be struck out and the following substituted therefor:

"this Bill be not now read a second time, but that it be read a second time this day six months hence."

And debate continuing;
