PRAYERS

Mr. Trudeau, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid upon the Table,—Copies of correspondence between the Prime Minister of Canada and the Premiers of the Provinces of Alberta and Saskatchewan concerning resource policy.—Sessional Paper No. 301-5/60.

Mrs. Sauvé, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid upon the Table,—Copies of Comments relating to Documents comprising the Syncrude Environmental Impact Assessment, dated August 19, 1974.—Sessional Paper No. 301-4/140.

On motion of Mr. Blais, seconded by Mr. Douglas (Bruce), the First Report of the Special Joint Committee on Employer-Employee Relations in the Public Service, presented to the House on Thursday, November 14, 1974, was concurred in.

Mr. Blais, seconded by Mr. Blaker, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-364, An Act to amend the Canada Pension Plan, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House. Mrs. Sauvé, seconded by Mr. Macdonald (Rosedale), by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-37, An Act to provide for the control of dumping of waste and other substances in the ocean, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The text of the Message and Recommendation of the Administrator pursuant to Standing Order 62(2) in relation to the foregoing Bill is as follows:

His Excellency the Administrator recommends to the House of Commons a measure to provide for the control of dumping waste and other substances in the ocean; to provide for the establishment of a Board of Review consisting of not more than three persons; to provide that the federal Crown is bound by the measure and for fines in contravention thereof in the amounts prescribed; and to provide for costs of the federal Crown to repair or remedy any condition or to mitigate any damage, and for their recovery.

The following Bill from the Senate was read the first time and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House:

Bill S-17, An Act to amend the Explosives Act.—Mr. Macdonald (Rosedale).
