Sir Arthur Cope authorizes me to tell you to show the contents of this letter to Sir Arthur Currie, or such other members of the Committee as have jurisdiction over the arrangements.

In making arrangements for broadcasting, it is understood that the press will have no objection to this, as Sir Alfred Cope made it plain that they depend on the press for the dissemination of the Hon. Lloyd George's message.
