

In the present year the average was 15 bushels per acre ; the balance, on account of a very dry season, yielded 10 bushels per acre. Now, for the present year, I have yielded 43 bushels. And for five years of 1887, when oats ranged 75 bushels ; an average of 75 bushels per acre. Mine is not an exceptional case. Mine is not an exceptional case. Mine is not an exceptional case. The present dry season may be different from the present dry one, and it convinces me of the truth of my circumstances. My crop this year had from near Guelph, Ontario, with a capital of £450 under cultivation ; will sow 35 bushels of seed, 4 colts rising one year, 4 colts rising two years old, 4 colts rising one year, worth \$1,000 (£250). Dwelling house, long time in Ontario to have gathered the wheat here is, six good crops and one poor one year in Ontario. I must say I am well satisfied with the one who is able and willing to work, and deal easier than in an older country. I have enough left after coming here to buy a pair of good teams and everything needed to work the land, but discouraged, but put in all the crop you can get. I have better ploughed this fall than I have ever before. This letter or any part of it, if of use to you, is corroborated by plenty of my neighbors,
