Morning Prayer:

If the Prayer (We humbly befeech Thee) shall the following be added; the People repeating the same after the Minister.

URN, Thou us, O good Lord, and so shall we be turned. Be favourable, O Lord, Be favourable to Thy People, who turn to Thee in weeping, sasting, and praying. For Thou art a merciful God, sull of compassion, long suffering, and of great pity. Thou sparest, when we deserve punishment; and in Thy wrath, Thou thinkest upon mercy. Spare Thy People, good Lord, spare them, and let not thine heritage be brought to confusion. Hear us, O Lord, for Thy mercy is great, and after the multitude of Thy mercies look upon us, through the merits and mediation of Thy blessed Son Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Instead of the Prayer in Time of War and Tumults, the tollogving shall be used:

God the King of Glory, in whose hands are all dominion and wisdom and victory, save and defend, we pray Thee, Thine anointed Servant our Sovereign. Establish his throne in righteousness, and compass him with Thy favour as with a shield. Bless his Counsellors with wisdom. Inspire his Captains and Commanders, and all his forces both by Sea and Land, with valour and patience; and teach them, and all their perils and hardships, whether in distant climates or on their native soil, to shew forth in their lives, and actions the united duties and graces of Christian Soldiers. O prosper them in all their doings with Thy gracious favour and protection! Grant them Thy support in all dangers and necessities, the strength of Thy arm to preserve them from evil, and the guidance of Thy Holy Spirit to lead them into all good.
