BRITAIN'S STRIKE DEPRESSES CORN

Suspension of All Sailings to United Kingdom Has Disturbing Effect.

Chicago, Sept. 29.—New declines in the value of corn took place today, owing exchange rates and to notice that, as a exchange rates and to notice that, as a result of the British railway strike, all sailings to the United Kingdom had been suspended. The market closed unsettled, 4c to 14c net lower, with December \$1.24% to \$1.24%, and May \$1.22% to \$1.22%. Oats finished unchanged to 14c down, and provisions varying from 80c decline to a rise of 70c.

Lack of support was evident from the outset in the corn market, with weakness of foreign exchange as temporarily the main bearish factor, supplemented by lower quotations on hogs. It was not however, until holding up of vessels in United tSates ports was announced that selling pressure became pronounced. A large amount of grain for the United

seiling pressure became pronounced. A large amount of grain for the United Kingdom was said to be waiting at the seaboard, and, with new loading of vessels prohibited, misgivings were expressed that interior congestion might ensue. Under such circumstances, bulls remained at a disadvantage thruout the session. Oats sympathized with corn weakness, notwithstanding a decrease in the oats visible supply total.

In provisions, as in grain, down-turns were the rule, as a result of the large stoppage of shippings to United Kingdom.

ON CHICAGO MARKET
