FUNERAL OF DR. WARDEN TRIBUTES TO HIS WORTH

Impressive Service at Bloor St. Pres. Church—Addresses by Rev. Dr. Armstrong and Principal Gordon.

The funeral of the late Rev. Dr. Warden took place yesterday afternoon at 2.30, with the burial at Mount Pleasant cemetery. A private service was first held at the home of Alexander Warden at 100 Spadina-road, after which the public services took place at Bloor-street Presbyterian Church at 2.30, with the burial at Mount Pleasant cemetery. The services were conducted by Rev. W. G. Wallace. Addresses and prayers were given by Rev. Dr. Armstrong of Ottawa, moderator of the general assembly, Rev. Principal Gordon of Queen's University, Dr. Campbell of Montreal and Rev. D. C. Hoessack, moderator of Toronto Presbytery. Dr. Campbell offered a simple but impressive prayer.

"We thank Thee, oh our Father," he said, "that Thy grace our dearly beloved brother was enabled to accomplish all the great good he has done. We thank Thee for Thy gift of Thy servant to his church, to his belief, and to his country."

Dr. Armstrong, then spoke of Dr. Warden as a man whose abilities were always admired by all who knew him, and whose life was inspired by love for his church.

Principal Gordon commented on the manner in which he modestly received the gifts conferred on him by the church and how bravely, patiently and even cheerfully he yielded to his suffering illness.

REV. DR. W. A. MACKAY DEAD.

Prominent Presbyterian and Protestantism Presses Award.

Woodstock, Nov. 28.—Rev. Dr. W. A. Mackay, for the past 30 years pastor of Chalmers church of this city, and ex-president of the Dominion Alliance, died this morning at 2.30 o'clock, after an illness extending over a year. He is survived by his wife and the following sons and daughters: John Mackay, business manager of The Toronto Globe; Robert Mackay of Toronto; W. D. Mackay of this city; Mrs. H. C. D. C. Cousins and Miss E. Mackay of this city.

He was 62 years of age and was one of the most prominent Presbyterian divines of Canada. Dr. Mackay was born in West Zorra, and received his primary education in Woodstock, after which he graduated from Toronto University. He was ordained in 1870. For 20 years he was president of the Oxford Protestant Alliance, president of the Dominion Alliance. He was the author of several books, including "Pioneer Life in Zorra" and "Zorra Boys Abroad."

OBITUARY.

A. M. Mackay.

St. John's, Nfld., Nov. 28.—A. M. Mackay, a Conservative member of the Newfoundland Assembly for 20 years, is dead aged 72 years. Mr. Mackay was superintendent of the Anglo-American Cable Company. He was a member of the Toronto office of the Montreal Telegraph Company in 1884, and was among the first operators to receive by sound.

Thomas Cosgrave.

The death took place Sunday night of Thomas Cosgrave at the home of his daughter-in-law, Mrs. W. H. Durand, 71 Montrose-ave. He had gone to bed the night before feeling fairly well, but was found dead the next day, having died from heart failure. He is survived by one daughter, Mrs. W. H. Durand, and two sons, Patrick and Thomas, living in Toronto.

The late Mr. Cosgrave was born in Limerick, Ireland, 66 years ago, and came to Canada alone at the age of 16 years to seek his fortune. He settled in Toronto, and has lived here ever since.

In religion he was a Roman Catholic, and a member of St. Mary's church.

Dr. Lemon.

Thorold, Nov. 28.—Dr. B. H. Lemon, an old and highly respected medical practitioner of the town, was found dead in his bed this morning. It is supposed that death was the result of a paralytic stroke. He was coroner for the counties of Lincoln and Welland. He had also filled the mayor's chair of the town some years ago.

J. B. Morford.

St. Thomas, Nov. 28.—John Baird Morford, assistant to the general manager of the Michigan Central Railway for the past two years, and formerly superintendent of the Canada Southern Division, died this morning from pneumonia. Mr. Morford contracted a severe cold while attending a railway men's meeting about two weeks ago in Montreal, and a week later pneumonia developed.

L. J. Sergeant.

Montreal, Nov. 28.—Grand Trunk officials received word this morning of the death in London, Eng., of L. J. Sergeant, former general manager of the road. Mr. Sergeant succeeded the late St. Joseph Erickson in the management. When the Hayes management took charge of the system Mr. Sergeant went to London as an advisory member of the board of directors.

GRANTED LEAVE TO APPEAL.

Validity of Railway Liability Act to Be Argued.

(Canadian Associated Press Cable.)

London, Nov. 28.—The privy council in Grand Trunk Railway versus the Attorney-General of the Dominion, granted special leave to appeal. Lord Davey expressed the view that the case was most important and should be argued on its constitutional points.

It is one of the validity of amending the act passed in the session of 1904, which prevents any railway company within control of the Dominion being relieved from liability for damages for personal injuries to workmen or employees in case they sign such conditions in an insurance policy with the company.

The privy council in *Grieve v. Tasker*, ruled that the Newfoundland court was not competent to give the leave to appeal, and that the renewed application here for leave is dismissed. The result is that the judgment in favor of Mrs. Tasker, Greenock, Scotland, against Grieve of St. John's for \$20,000, a property dispute, stands.
