Brinson, Ga., July 25.—Charles Mack, leader of the gang that has been robbing and rapeing in this vicinity, was lynched at Saffold to-day and his body cut into hundreds of pieces. Mack was taken to the big oak tree near the Ogletree home, on which Sammins met his death, and strung up. As his feet left the ground hundreds of shots from the mob were fired into his body. After he was dead, he was taken down and the body cut into small pieces and distributed among the mob, which numbered two or three hundred.
