CONTRACTORS AND THE CITY

Controllers Differ in Opinion as to the Award of Those Concrete Sidewalk Contracts.

PLAN FOR A NEW PARK ROAD.

Board of Control Still Slashing at the Estimates - Notes From the City Hall.

There were symptoms of excitement with the estimate concrete sidewalk contracts turned up once more in the Board of Control yesterday afternoon. The Mayor was away, but Ald. McMurich and Ald. Crane stuck to their contention, previously expressed, that Stames and Blome of Chicago, as the lowest tenderers, should get the contracts.

BUDGET DEBATE CONTINUES

Conservative Whip Taylor Shows How the Government Has Broken Its Promises.

POINTS OUT GENUIS IMPERFECTIONS

Dr. Roche, From the West, Has Warm Words For Minister Sifton. Ottawa, April 3 - The debate on the budget was resumed by the Conservative whip today. Mr. Taylor quoted the tariff upon agricultural products to show that the farmer was protected despite statements of hon. gentlemen opposite, to the effect that the farmer cannot be protected under the tariff.

Broken Promises.

Dealing with the policy of the government as compared with the Liberal party's profession in opposition, Mr. Taylor expressed the belief that the sleep of Ministers must be disturbed by the unfulfilled promises of economy, of reciprocity and the fair settlement of the Manitoba school question. It was the Premier's pledge that he would send Sir Oliver Mowat to settle the question; but the man sent was the gentleman who doesn't believe that elections are made with prayers, and the result was a bargain whereby the irrevocables, Messrs. Sifton, Martin and Prendergast, were provided for - Mr. Sifton with the portfolio of interior, Mr. Joe Martin with the portfolio of justice, and Mr. Prendergast with a judgeship. Another promise was that there would be a cabinet reshuffle, but the only business man in it was the Minister of Customs, who took good care to have the duty maintained on the biscuit manufacture.

Imperfect Census.

At a cost of \$200,000 more than was expended on the census of 1911, the government had taken a census in 1916 which was manifestly imperfect. The Town of Gananogue the census was 192 short of the correct population, and taking the County of Leeds and Grenville in all, the census showed a decrease of 10,000 in the population, whereas the municipal count shows a gain of 10,000. Comparing the main estimates of 1916 with the main estimates of the present year, there was an increase of \$1,000,000 in interest on the public debt, an increase of \$2,000,000 in agriculture, \$123,000 in immigration, an increase of \$25,000,000 in railways, an increase of \$24,000,000, or \$1,857,000 in total.

Pronounces Granoze Palatable and Nutritious - A Most Worthy Charity. Hugh John McNeil says: "I am not surprised at the vote, when the position taken by the Dominion Alliance is considered. 'The vote, you think, should have been larger.' 'Yes, I do not think the test was a fair one, as while those opposed to prohibition were united and acting with great harmony and good organization, the temperance people were spending their time discussing whether or not it was desirable to bring the vote out, and they were without organization. Both sides suffered, no doubt, from the wet state of the roads and the difficulty thus caused in the country in getting the vote out.' 'But,' says Mr. Macdonald, 'I was surprised that you should know no more on this subject than an ordinary citizen.' 'No True Temperance View. Rev. Mr. McNeil said that he did not consider, nor did he think the country would take, the vote of yesterday as representing the true temperance sentiment of the country. In view of the fact that the leaders of the government ignored their own act, the temperance people had no faith in the vote yesterday, which does not in any particular represent public opinion. 'The result indicates to me very clearly that the country is not prepared for a strictly prohibitory measure. Temperance must work altogether along the line of restricting the traffic as much as possible by enforcing strict license regulations and getting the whole business under a modified form of the Gathmer system, by which public bars would be closed, the trading customers stopped, and the traffic brought under the control of government or municipal control. Prohibition, as such, will be a dead issue for many years in this province. 'Larger Than Expected. The Telegram, government organ, says: 'Of the vote, it may be said that it was larger than was expected. Few thought that under the present conditions prevailing, so many would go to the polls. That the vote was large must be regarded as a satisfactory feature. It shows that the people of the province took the question seriously, and the verdict must be viewed in that light. Another point of special significance is the great increase in the number who turned out to record their votes against a concrete prohibition, who remained at home when a general question was submitted at the previous plebiscite. This fact seems to bear out the contention of those who held that the result of these plebiscites should not be accepted as a sufficient indication of the will of the people. Any analysis of the vote and further inferences must be left until particular cases are at hand. 'Our Papers' Comment. The Tribune accuses the method of voting, and says the whole business was largely farcical in view of the wide, open character of the referendum. The Free Press criticizes the government's course, and charges that the prohibition league was for the purpose of helping the government.
