The late Frank Selee won five Na-tional League pennants for Boston in 1891, 1892, 1893, 1897 and 1898. Ned Hanlon has five championships to his credit. He won three with Baltimore In 1894, 1895 and 1896, and two with Brooklyn in 1899 and 1900.






