The visits of many kind ladies are highly valued, and much has been done by such loving and tender hands to make the Home a quiet resting place for many whose remaining time must be short.

THE NORMAL SCHOOL.

The class of Church of England students has been conducted every Friday by the Rector and the Rev. Mr. Hobson. This is a very important and encouraging work.
