"Babe" Ruth's contract carries no bonus for home runs, according to an official announcement made by Col. Jacob Ruppert, part owner of the Yankees.

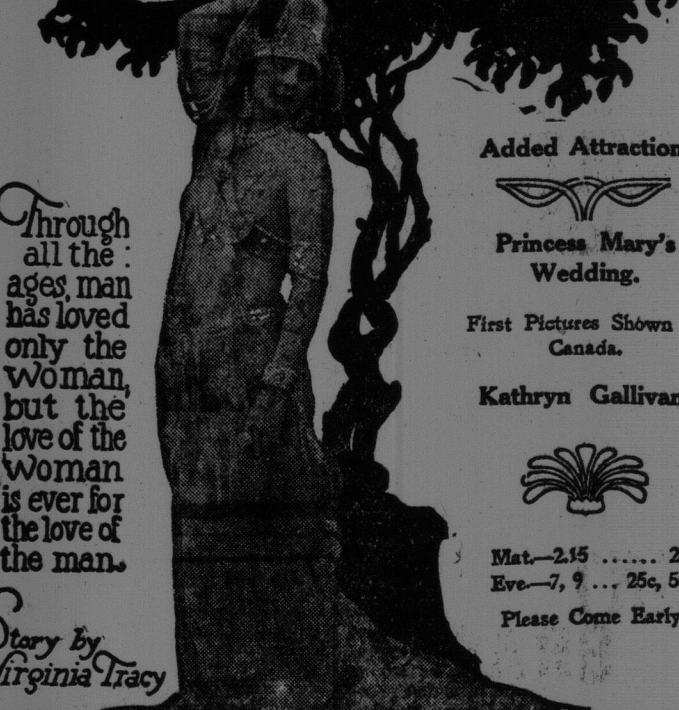
BASKETBALL.

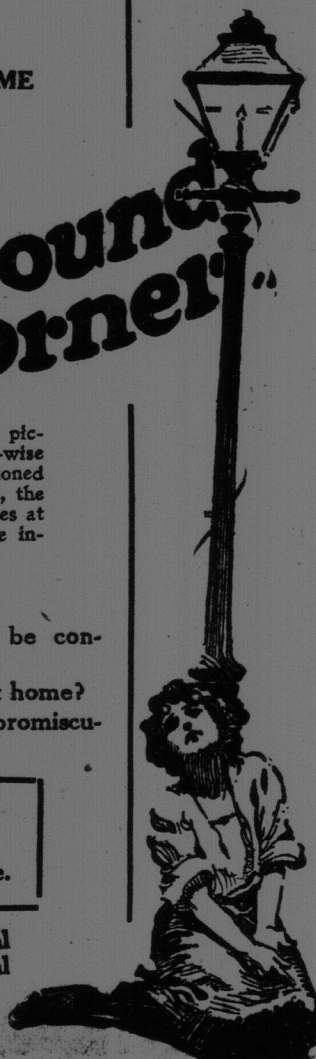
