B. C. FARMERS IN CONVENTION

Looking for a Membership Growth to 10,000

President Speaks of Federal Elections—Okanagan Fruit Man Says Union for Political Effort Waste of Time.

(Canadian Press.) Victoria, B. C., Feb. 24.—The convention of the United Farmers of British Columbia opened here yesterday. Candidates for parliament who are farmers and who know the needs of the farming communities are all right and I believe we ought to have more of them in parliament," said W. F. Laidman of Vernon, a fruit grower of the Okanagan. "But a union of the farmers, a political effort at this time, I think would be a waste of effort. Our time

should be spent in the development of our business and in the pushing forward of measures that will assist along that line. We have no time for play." He strongly urged the formation of a British Columbia council of agriculture members.

"What about the Canadian council of agriculture which is so much talked about?" he was asked.

"That will come later," he replied, "but a strong provincial organization should come first."

The central secretary's report showed that the growth of the organization during the last few months had been very rapid. The membership up to the end of 1919 was only about 1,200, but it was now more than 4,800 and there were newly organized locals which had not reported.

President Copeland said the object of the united farmers and the united farm women was to increase the membership in this province to 10,000 next year.

THREE SAID TO BE IN DISGRACE

MILLIONS IN A SAD PLIGHT

Dr. Robertson Points to Starving Peoples of Europe—Matter of High Prices.

Montreal, Feb. 24.—Dr. Robertson, speaking before the Canadian Club yesterday, said that in Europe today there were between ten to fifteen millions of people who during the coming summer will be either on the verge of destitution or absolutely starving. As Canadian manufacturers of food supplies, Dr. Robertson said that Canadians were clamoring for the government to put prices down, the European governments were trying to keep them up because there would be lack of production without good prices.

Canada's reputation now was such that she would get the world's best prices for all she had to sell. "My own opinion is that we shall in the next few years do well in agriculture with a profit in response to efforts."

RE-ORGANIZE STREET RAILWAY

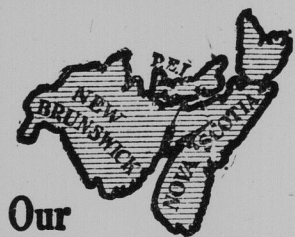
Plan of State Ownership and Private Operation in Providence Suggested.
