1,000,000 QUARTS OF LIQUOR SOLD UNDER PRESCRIPTION IN ONTARIO

Toronto, April 4—Since Ontario went under prohibition, in September 1916, and up to March 1 of this year, over one million quarts of liquor have been sold under prescriptions, by the legal vendors, under the Ontario temperance act.

This was an estimate furnished to the public accounts committee of the legislature this morning by J. D. Flavelle, chairman of the Ontario license board.

Mr. Flavelle further stated that it did not include liquor obtained by physicians for their own use.

Since the coming into force of the O. T. A., there were 3,600 commitments to prison under the act. Intoxicating was the charge in 4,700 of these, and other offences under the act accounted for the remaining 3,600.

A total of \$1,230,000 was realized in fines paid for infractions of the act.

The total production of rye in Germany, Denmark, Spain, Ireland, Italy, Luxembourg, Norway, Netherlands, Sweden, Switzerland, Canada and the United States for 1918 was 496,200,000 bushels, as compared with 409,096,000 in 1917.
