ST. JOHN IN GALA DRESS WELCOMES ITS DISCOVERER

Most Successful Celebration in City's History Passes Off Without a Hitch

Three Nations Unite in Reception of Champlain, De Monts and Poutrincourt and in Unveiling of Monument to Canadian Heroes.

The spectacular feature of the Tercentenary celebration is over and it is safe to say that never in the history of this city had there been such a success, unless it was when three hundred years ago one June morning a French frigate rounded the island with the gallant explorer Champlain and sailed up the harbor and in a short time succeeded in convincing the natives of his peaceful intention, exchanged gifts, presented them with a royal proclamation from the King of France, marvelled at their dances and smoked their pipe of peace. This was the scene that was reproduced this morning, and every detail was carried out to the satisfaction of all.

THE RECEPTION. After landing they all went to the centre of the hollow square, formed by the soldiers and here a general popow was held. Attired in a gorgeous costume stood T. T. Lantimou, representing Champlain, while on either side stood W. H. Harrison as Poutrincourt and H. M. Stanbury as de Monts.

THE INDIAN ATTACK. Suddenly there was another cannon report and from round the stern of the French cruiser and from the direction of Navy Island came numerous canoes filled with wildly gesticulating Indians.

THE ARRIVAL. As the hour of nine o'clock drew near the harbor was almost impeded by the arrival of the various ships, which were, of course, the centre of attraction, one of the prettiest pictures was the yacht club fleet, anchored well up toward the head of the harbor. All the boats were handsomely decorated.

RUSSIAN ATTACK IS REPULSED.

Attempts to Advance Toward Korea Checked.

Persistent Reports of Another Japanese Attack on Port Arthur—Result is Unknown.

TOKIO, June 24.—(3 p. m.)—Four thousand Russians, including infantry, cavalry and artillery attacked Yank Pien Mon about fifty miles northeast of Feng Wang Cheng last Tuesday. The Russians were repulsed and retreated toward Shinakaling. The Russians lost five killed and twenty wounded. The Japanese loss is not given.

THE MILITARY PARADE. The military parade of the demonstration was exceptionally well handled. Before nine o'clock the local militiamen, together with a detachment from H. M. S. Ariadne, one hundred men from the U. S. cruiser Detroit, a small detachment from the French cruiser Troude and the city cadet corps formed in Market square in line of quarter column.

UNVEILING THE MONUMENT. The monument was draped in the Union Jack, and when Dr. Gilchrist took charge of the proceedings, a brilliantly colored gathering was grouped in and around the pedestal.
