## BOARD OF TRADE.

Eleven of Schofield's Twelve Resolutions Approved by the Board.

A meeting of the board of trade was held last evening for the purpose of discussing the resolutions prepared by Samuel Schofield, with the object of increasing the membership and influence of the board. Only eleven members were present, and it was not until twenty-five minutes past the hour announced for the opening of the meeting that enough members assembled to form a quorum.

A few moments after the meeting began the following telegram was received by H. B. Schofield, president of the board:

Under Pottinger's management the railway don't care to accommodate the public. No train in tonight, therefore can't be at meeting.

In moving his resolution, of which 11 out of 12 carried, Mr. Schofield remarked that a larger membership was needed. For the opening of the meeting and vice-president be changed each year. Carried.

The resolution advocating a change in the membership of the council from 18 to 30 caused considerable discussion, but was carried.

The third resolution, referring to the mailing to each member, one week previous to annual meetings, suitable ballot forms, enabling them to vote even if they were not able to be present, was carried.

The board also discussed at great length the resolution reducing the fee from ten to five dollars, and ask the city banks and large mercantile banks to give special annual contributions to aid in the work of the board.

The resolution that the secretary should give his entire time to the work of the board was lost.

The other resolutions dealing with matters of less importance all passed. The whole will be referred to the council.
