

The question of supply and demand in connection with the fox business is important. Here again conitions show a remarkable difference. During the months of June, July and August, 1913, it was estimated that over one hundred and fifty options could be purchased at prices ranging from \$8,500 to \$10,000 and for the greater part of that time very few sales were made. To date a canvass of the Island for options reveals the startling fact that there are less than fifty options to be had, and since June first of this year the lowest quotation was \$11,000. From July 1st to the present prices have advanced steadily until now the best grade foxes are bringing \$12,500 to \$13,500, and unless this Fall differ radically from last, September will see 1914 pups sold at \$18,000.

### ON BETTER FOOTING THAN EVER BEFORE

The Fox business is now more firmly established than ever.

The fox situation at present as compared to a corresponding period last year is a positive improvement of fully fifty per cent. Not so much in price, although an advance of twenty-five per cent. in price over last July is noted, but in the spirit of confidence exhibited by all connected with the industry, a spirit induced by the fact that the business is not to stop at Island financing but is to go on through the medium of English, United States and Canadian capital. A year ago the attitude of the financial world, more particularly the banks, was decidedly hostile, today fox companies are in existence that have as officers, presidents and treasbanks, was decidedly hostile, today for companies are in existence that have as officers, presidents and treasurers of banks and only recently a large trust company sent men to the Island to investigate the business.

The questions to the fore last summer are not in evidence this, with the exception perhaps of one that is asked occasionally, namely: Will the new companies take up their options. Depending on Island financing the result would be doubtful, but there is no mistaking the fact that outside capital is being interested and to an extent that bids fair to dwarf all investments made heretofore by Islanders. Up to last year the lure of dividends had not spread much beyond Prince Edward Island but the thousands that went out last fall are now having effect and when 1914 dividends go out in greatly increased proportions, watch out for a flood of outside investing money.

#### STILL POPULAR



Up to August 15th, 1913, there was practically no life in the fox business. Shortly after that date, however, conditions changed, prices worked higher, going from \$10,000 to \$12,000, and when September came in \$14,000 was the market. An advance of \$4,000 within three weeks and, most astonishing to contemplate, this advance took place in the face of a payment of over \$3,500,000, the sum needed to complete payments on foxes bought. A certain Boston bank manager who was aware of the money needed to carry the business onto a firm basis, in August of 1913 deplored the awful calamity that was about to befail the Island. His fears proved groundless and if he is not personally interested in foxes today he should be. The turning over of that money, a large sum for an Island of this size, was

evidently the passing of the crisis in the fox industry. Later came dividends and then new financing based upon renewed confidence and the fox industry had accomplished the impossible and was ready for the second stage of its development. Starting in June, 1913, with a total lack of confidence on the part of the general public, it ended the year more firmly established than ever.

The Foxes seem to be gaining in popularity among all nationalities.
