Ottawa, April 22.—Further details have become available of the contract awarded by the government of Russia to the Canada Car and Foundry Company. The total is eighty-three million dollars. Pive million shrapned and howlizer shells are to be manufactured at an average cost of \$17.85.
Out of the total contract sub-contracts to the amount of \$21,724,000 have been subbet to thirty-seven American firms for various amounts and further contracts are pendins.

A large part of the work, however, is to be done in Canada by the Canada Car and Foundry Company, while other canadian firms not already filled up with British orders are likely to participate in the execution of the huse order, the final negotiations for which were conducted by Senator Nathaniel Curry.
