Saw Log Cut Small

The amount of the season's cut on the St. Croix destined to be sawed into lumber at the sawmills is small, possibly seven or eight million feet. These logs are for the mill of H. F. Eaton & Co. at Calais and are cut off the Eaton land on the West St. Croix river lakes and on the East Grand lake, together with about five million feet which will be cut this season of Indian Township which is state land. The St. Croix Paper Co. also saws considerable lumber at its sawmill in connection with the pulp mill, the hemiock and pine and the best of the spruce being used for this purpose.
