

With reference to the above, the following regulations have been adopted.

Corps provided with regulation uniform at their own expense, are entitled to receive the allowance of three dollars per man in money.

Corps not in debt to the Government for former supplies of clothing, may apply for an issue of such articles as are required, to keep their uniform clothing in an efficient state.

Corps heretofore supplied with clothing by the Government, should forward their requisitions for any new outfits that may be required, at least six months before the clothing is actually to be taken into wear, in order that the necessary provision may be made by the Department.

Corps which have procured uniforms at their own expense in the past, and desire to be furnished with new outfits in the future, from the Government stores, should give timely notice thereof to the Department.

Corps wishing to replace their own uniforms in preference to the purchase from Government, may receive six dollars for every new suit ordered, and received by them, and reported as good and conformable to the Government pattern by the Inspecting Officer, which six dollars will in effect be the clothing allowance for two years.

The annual clothing allowance will not be paid in money to any corps indebted to the Department for clothing, but the same will be retained until the debit for the article issued to the corps shall be liquidated.

When volunteers are called out for active service, the corps will be credited on its clothing account, (in
