With further reference to your letter of the 16th December last I beg to inform you that the Abenakis Indians of St. Francis have expressed their willingness to accept a Reserve of 8360 acres between the points marked "A" and "B" on the enclosed Plan and North of the portion coloured red and under Timber License by your Department.

I shall be glad if you will reserve the land between these points from settlement and this Department will at the earliest opportunity take the necessary steps to have the same surveyed as a Reserve for the Abenakis.

I shall also be glad if you will reserve 300 acres at Coccooche at the point indicated on the enclosed Plan or if this cannot be done ^{the same may be} ~~reserved immediately North of the St. Maurice River~~ *at what the point to reserve can be granted.* ^{Not be found amongst the}

These two Reserves along with that at Weymongachingué will complete the allotment for the Algonquins, Têtes des Poules and the Abenakis of St. Francis.
