

THE ELIBANK INCIDENT  
PRESS AND PUBLIC COMMENT.

Lord Elibank's speech and the Minister's criticism thereon evoked much public discussion.

Conservative papers, with general unanimity undertook to rebuke the Minister of National Defence for rudeness. Some of them went on to accuse the Minister of disloyalty.

Other newspapers shared the view expressed by the Minister, that Lord Elibank had improperly intruded in the domestic affairs of this Country.

The Toronto papers all published interviews with leading citizens, on Lord Elibank's remarks, the day after he spoke, and prior to the public comment of the Minister of National Defence.
