

Ottawa July 16, 1908

Sir,—

Mr. O.T. Daniels of Bridgetown, N.S., has written to S.W. Pickup, Esq., M.P., in the interest of Noel Labrador an Indian who resides near Paradise on a plot of land containing ten acres on the Annapolis River taken off the rear end of a Glebe lot. It is not known how this land was reserved for the Indians or what right Labrador has to occupy it. Labrador desires to obtain a title to the property. I have to request you to be good enough to look into the matter and render Mr. Labrador any assistance you can.

If you should ascertain that the land was set apart as a reserve for an Indian or Indians please report to the Department in full, and advise what action in your opinion should be taken.
