Treaty Payments, York Factory
and Churchill.

I have the honour to enclose, in duplicate, correspondence received from Sergeant Stangroom of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, with respect to Treaty Payments at the above mentioned points this summer, showing the expenditure of \$3,150.00, together with draft on the Hudson's Bay Company, in your favour, for the sum of \$350.00, making a total of \$3,500.00.

Attached to the correspondence is also an account in favour of the Hudson's Bay Company for the sum of \$102.00 for meals supplied to natives employed as canoe men from Port Nelson to York Factory and return, which has not yet been paid.

The voucher for \$35.00, which is also attached was paid from the annuity money, as set forth in Sergeant Stangroom's letter to you, dated August 15th, 1923.
