Dear Mr. Ditchburn -

On the occasion of the recent inspection of the Lytton Industrial School by Mr. Cairns, the Principal drew attention to the number of pupils who require dental treatment. I am sure that these Indian pupils in many cases require such treatment, and I would like to consider what arrangements we might make to have a dentist visit this school. The Principal states that there is no one nearer than Vancouver or Kamloops.

I wish you would make enquiry with a view to ascertaining what a reliable dentist would charge us for extractions and fillings, provided he were allowed to treat all the children who would require attention.
