Question.

- Q 5 \*Do you wish to apply for an adjournment on the ground that any of the rules relating to procedure before trial have not been complied with, and that you have been prejudiced thereby, or on the ground that you have not had sufficient opportunity for preparing your defence?

A 6 Yes, Sir.

- Q 7 N.C.O. in charge of Records?

A 7 Yes, Sir.

- Q 8 Do you know the accused No. C-600101, Sapper Harry Jones?

A 8 Yes, Sir, the man sitting in the centre there is Sapper Jones.  
(Pointing out the accused).

- Q 9 I produce to you a document, what is that?

A 9 M.F.B. 375 and it refers to the accused Sapper Jones.

M. F.B. 375 is read, marked " G ", signed by the President  
and attached to the proceedings.

- Q 10 And what is this document, Sergeant?

A 10 M.F.M. 216 and it refers to the apprehension of the accused.

M.F.M. 216 is read, marked " H ", signed by the President  
and attached to the proceedings.

- Q 11 What is this document, Sergeant?

A 11 M.F.B. 1481 referring to the accused Sapper Jones, Sir.

M.F.B. 1481 is read, marked " I ", signed by the President  
and attached to the proceedings.
