

- (2) The dog ran *here* and *there*.
- (3) The judge decided *carefully*.
- (4) The clock strikes *hourly*.
- (5) You must not look *down*.
- (6) John is a *very* good boy.
- (7) The girl behaves *tolerably* well.

A word used to limit the meaning of a verb, an adjective, or an adverb, is called an **adverb**.
