**THE** House having by several Proclamations been prorogued until this day, then to meet for the dispatch of business, and being met—

A Message from His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, requiring the attendance of the House in the Council Chamber.

The House attended, and being returned—

Mr. Weldon moved for leave to bring in a Bill to revive an Act to prevent desertion from His Majesty's Forces, and to prevent all unlawful dealings with Soldiers or Deserters.

Leave granted.

Mr. Speaker then reported, that His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor had been pleased to make a Speech to both Houses, of which he had procured a copy, and is as follows :—

*Mr. President and Honorable Gentlemen of His Majesty's Council,  
Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly,*

**I**T gives me much satisfaction to meet you again in General Assembly, and I rejoice that press of business has not obliged me to call you together before the period, which I was led to suppose on a former occasion, would be the best suited to the convenience of the Members of both Houses.

In thus meeting you for the second time, it was my wish to have avoided a repetition of any of the subjects adverted to in my address at the opening of the last Session; but I feel myself most reluctantly called upon again to draw your attention to the state of the Great Roads throughout the Province, the unfinished and ruinous condition of many of the lines so termed, evinces, after the liberal appropriations made
