Ordered, That Major Murray and Captain Lyman wait on His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor to know when he will be pleased to receive this House with their address in answer to His Excellency's speech. Committee appointed to wait on his Excellency.

Mr. Hardy by leave brought up a petition from the Magistrates of the county of Northumberland.

Which being read,

Petition read.

Was Ordered to lie on the table.

Resolved, that the Speaker be impowered to adopt such means for facilitating the attendance of the members at the House during the present session, as he shall think proper; and that this House will make good any expences attending the same. Resolve for facilitating the attendance of the members.

Mr. Glenie by leave brought up a petition from a number of the inhabitants of Magerville praying an act of the Legislature for establishing permanent marks or bounds to the several rights or shares in the said township—and moved for leave to bring in “A Bill for fixing permanently the Boundary Lines between the different Grants throughout the Province.” Petition read. Leave to bring in a Bill.

Leave was given.

Ordered, That Mr. Chipman, Mr. William Pagan and Major Coffin be a committee to examine and report such laws as have expired or are near expiring. Committee to report on the expiring laws.

On motion of Mr. William Pagan.

Resolved, That the Clerk be directed to furnish the printer, from time to time, with copies of the Journal of this House, that the same may be published in sheets as early as possible for the information of the public: And that an abstract of the proceedings of this House be also sent to the printers for immediate publication. Resolve for printing the Journal in sheets, and an abstract in the Newspapers.

The committee appointed to examine and report such laws as have expired or are near expiring, made the following report.

That “An Act to lay a Tax on Dogs” expired on the 1st May 1790.
