A GOOD REPORT

Dr. Bruce Smith Praises the Work at the Brant Sanitarium.

Dr. R. W. Bruce Smith has submitted the following report on the Brant Sanitarium, which is decidedly pleasing to those in charge:

"An official visit of inspection was made at the Brant Sanitarium, Brantford, November 27th, 1914, when there were 3 males, 2 females, a total of 7 patients in residence."

On inspection, the general condition of all parts of the building was found most satisfactory.

The number of admissions during the past year was 32.

The records indicate that this Sanitarium has been carefully and prudently conducted and is doing good work. There is always, as can naturally be expected, a large expenditure in starting a new institution, but the different items of expenditure all indicate caution that is commendable to those in charge.

The total cost of maintenance during the past year was \$5,964.95.

This Sanitarium has certainly been of great benefit and the conditions under which it is operated are likely to have the same measure of success as similar institutions in other parts of Ontario which have in a very short time, with the Government grant, received from pay patients, become self-sustaining. The Government grant, at the rate of \$3.00 per week, has been to this institution for the past year \$1,159.71.

CASE DISMISSED

Adjutant Hargrove of Salvation Army Charged in Police Court.

Adjutant Hargrove was charged at the police court this morning with breach of the city by-laws by R. Greenaway, a local second-hand clothes dealer. The magistrate, after hearing the evidence, had no doubt in dismissing the case summarily.

He described Greenaway's store as a very small one, and said it should never have been taken. The case was that the Salvation Army has for some time given old clothes to indigent people in exchange for their own, and the dealer has been selling them.

Greenaway took exception to this, claiming that they were breaking the by-laws regarding the sale of old clothes. To test his theory he sent his child to the home, and there obtained for 15c a serviceable little coat.

The people in charge of the home thought it a bona fide case of necessity. Upon this, Mr. Greenaway took action, and the case was justly dismissed by Magistrate Livingston to-day.

William Goodfellow will eat a Christmas dinner of good cheer in the confines of a jail, at his own request. He was a vagrant, admitted it, and asked for a good term of imprisonment to tide him over the winter. He was obliged.

William Lynn answered a charge of assault laid by William Holt, and the case was dismissed upon payment of costs.

IN DIRE STRAITS.

LEMBERG, Dec. 10, via Petrograd and London, 2.50 p.m.—Prisoners who were taken in a sortie made by the garrison on the Austrian fortress of Przemyel were brought here yesterday.

They declare all the inhabitants of Przemyel have deserted the city and that it is fast becoming uninhabitable. Food stores have become exhausted, they say, and few cattle are left.

New Zealand

Opposes More [For Temperance]

(By Special Wire to the Courier)

WELLINGTON, N.Z., via London, Dec. 11—10.15 a.m.—The election returns though incomplete indicate that the licensing position is unchanged and that national prohibition has not been carried. The prohibitionists received 13,000 votes in several places.

The returns give the government 38 members of parliament, the prohibition 30, and the Labor Social Democrats 8. As the latter support the opposition party, the strength in parliament is equal, though the votes of the soldiers abroad are yet to be counted, and may effect the result.
