Legal Decisions

1. Any person who takes a paper regularly from the Post Office—whether directed to his name or another's or whether sent by subscription or not—is responsible for the payment.

2. If a person orders his paper discontinued, he must pay up all arrearages, or the publisher may continue to send it until the amount is paid, and the paper is taken from the office of the Post.
