

The Emperor Opens the Reichstag.

A PEACEFUL ADDRESS Berlin, June 25.—The Reichstag was opened today with pomp and brilliancy. After Divine service in the Court Chapel opened today with points and the court Chapel the Emperor was escorted with great ceremony to the white hall of the old Castle, where he declared the session opened. Throughout his speech the Emperor dwelt upon Germany's pacific disposition. He said her policy aimed to ward off attack, and not to acquire military glory. The Empire, he declared, desired peace with all nations. The Emperor said further, "Germany will adhere to her alliance with Austria, which public opinion supports as the basis of European equilibrium and an inheritance of German history. The same relations and nationel needs united Germany and Italy. These relations will permit the careful oultivation of the Emperor's personal friendship with the Czar and the maintenance of the pacific relations with Russia, which have existed for a century, in consonance with the Emperor's feelings and Germany's interests."

During the reading of the speech he was During the reading of the speech ne was requently interrupted by cheers. At the conclusion of the address the Emperor shook hands with Prince Biemarck, who then kissed His Majesty's hand. At the close of the proceedings Baron Lutz proposed three more cheers for the Emperor, and when the procession left the hall the members were still cheering loudly.

The Scene Over Harrison's Nomination.

Levi P Morton for Vice-President.

Chicago, June 25.—The announcement of the vote that gave Harrison the nomination was followed by great confusion in the hall, the delegates rising to their feet and cheering and the bands playing.

Foraker, of Ohio, moved to make the nomination unanimous. Hoar seconded the motion.

Alger telegraphed his sympathy and pledged the support of Michigan. The telegram was greeted with great applause. The nomination was made unanimous. The nomination was made unanimous. The Convention adjourned till 6 o'clock. That the interest in the Convention had almost entirely died away with the Presidential nomination in the evening was manifest by the array of empty seats in the contract of the manifest by the array of empty seats in the galleries, which previously have presented an attractive picture of handsome toilets and kaleidoscopic colors. The Convention reassembled at ten minutes past six and proceeded to the regular order, the presentation of names for the Yice-Presidential nomination. They then proceeded to ballot with this result:—First ballot, Vice-President—Morton 591, Phelps 119, Bradley 103, B. K. Bruce 11, W. F. Thomas 1. Mr. Denny, of Kentucky, moved that Mr. Morton's nomination be made unanimous. The motion nation be made unanin rough draft of the address delivered to-

Rentucky, moved that Mr. Morton's nomination be made unanimous. The motion was agreed to and the chair declared that Mr. Morton was the nominee of the Convention for Vice President.

Mr. Boutelle, of Maine, then rose to move that another plank be added to the Republican platform, when ensued a scene of great confusion, several delegates trying to speak at the same time. Finally quiet was restored, and Mr. Boutelle read the resolution as follows:—"The first concern of all good Governments is the entire sobriety of the people and the purity of their homes. The Republican party cordially sympathise with all wise and well directed efforts for the promotion of Temperance and morality." As soon as this was read it was adopted by a rising vote. A vote of thanks was then tendered to the chairman and other members of the convention and then on motion of Mr. Hiscock the convention at 8:52 adjourned without date. without date.

Indianapolis, June 25.—A few minutes after one o'clock, when it became apparafter one o'clock, when it became appar-ent that Harrison's nomination was pro-bable, the excitement in the streets be-came intense. When Tennessee made his nomination certain tremendous cheers broke forth, and the crowds from all the bulletin boards made a frantic rush for Gen. Harrison's law office, in Market Gen. Harrison's law office, in Market street, shouting, waving hats, umbrellas and cause as they went. In an incredibly short space of time the broad street was packed with thousands of cheering men, many of whom rushed into his office, crowding around him and cheering themselves hoarse. The halls and rooms were packed and in front of the building was a mass of people waving flags, hats, canes and handkerchiefs. A continuous stream of people passed around the general as he stood in the centre of the room. Each man gave him a hearty shake of the hand, and many were too excited to give any expressions of their feeling.

HOW CONGRESS RECEIVED THE NEWS How congress received the News.
Washington, June 25.—As soon as the officer read, "Harrison is nominated," the Republicans cheered wildly, each member waving in the air a small American flag, bearing the inscription "Protection for American Industry." The Democrats gazed for a moment on the scene and then joined heartily in the applause, several bandannas making their appearance in answer to the challenge on the other side.
