Howard's which was generally copied in the British press, that English investors hesitated granting further advances until the market became easier. Those who spoke against Messrs. Davies, Fraser and Welsh were Messrs. Hon. C. H. Tupper, Mr. Dickey, Mr. Hazen and Mr. Josiah Wood. Who would Capt. Howard support if he were to leave the Conservatives who have defended the work to a man, or the Liberals who have with a few exceptions always opposed it?
