## Fredericton Bred Horse Leads Provincial Breds

(Walter H. Puts on Fastest Mile at Halifax)

Mile by Son of Montrose Eclipses Performances of the Past

THREE YEAR OLD RECORD BROKEN

Frank Patch Wins the Free For All at Halifax Once More.

Walter H's mile in 2:16 1/4 at Halifax on Saturday stamps him as the fastest New Brunswick bred horse — trotter or pacer — and his mile was the fastest ever trotted or paced on a track in the Maritime Provinces by a horse bred in the Maritime Provinces.

Walter H was bred by Dennis E. Hanlon, of this city, who named him after his son, Walter H. is by Montrose, the stallion owned here for years by the late John McCoy, while Mr. Hanlon was the owner of Minnie N, his dam. The fast record taken by Walter H has brought much joy to Mr. Hanlon, who has received many congratulations as the breeder of such a fine performing trotter.

August, Sept. 2.—There were three well contested races at the exhibition track this afternoon, the 2:20 trot and pace was won in straight heats. It took five heats to decide the 2:20 trot stake and four for the 2:15 trot and pace. Matside, Chicago, Ills., Sept. 4.—The wrestling championship of the world remains at Humbolt, Iowa. It took Frank Gotch, who made this town famous, just 19 minutes and 50 seconds to topple over Georges Hackenschmidt, who has thus twice failed to wrest the world's highest wrestling honors from the sturdy Iowan. Gotch secured the first fall with a reverse body lock in 14 minutes and 18 1/2 seconds; the second fall required exactly 5 minutes 31 1/2 seconds. According to general comment Hackenschmidt entered the ring a beaten man. He looked a loser. Gotch supremely confident, was master of the situation at all stages.
