MISSISSIPPI.—The celebrated Dublin brewer, H. de la Beche, by his son, Sir Arthur E. Guinness, who has accepted the nomination as a Representative for the city of Dublin.

The Secretary of the Hudson's Bay Company, in a contradiction of the statement of the London Herald, writes that no agreement has yet been made with Her Majesty's Government for the transfer of the territory.

MONTREAL OCEAN STEAM FLEET.—During the summer months of 1868, under the auspices of the Montreal and Quebec Steam Navigation Company, no less than sixteen large ocean steamships ply between Montreal and Great Britain.

Two French vessels of war, the ship Jean Bart and the brig Octave, were fired at by the New York gunboat, the USS Albatross, on the 15th inst.

General McClellan has, it is said, written a letter declining to be a candidate, but promising to take the stamp for whomever the New York convention may nominate.

An "ecclesiastical church" to the memory of Maximilian is building at Vienna. Trieste has raised twenty thousand forins to erect a monument to the same unfortunate prince.

The Emperor of Russia has issued a ukase setting free all persons of foreign birth now exiled to Siberia, and all natives of Russian Poland who are sentenced to less than twenty years exile.

A new editor of a Kansas paper confesses in his salutation, that he expects his contemporaries to remind him of the trial of Jeff. Davis.

The trial of Jeff. Davis has been again postponed until October, but no one believes it will take place then, or that his case will ever be heard before a court of law.

The trial of Charles Hastings Doyle, for the murder of the New Brunswick Provincial Rifle Association, will commence at Sussex, on Thursday, 1st September.

A French soldier, who during the Crimean war deserted and went to St. Petersburg, has recently been distinguished at Derby, yesterday afternoon and two miles from the city.

An English paper reports that Vice Admiral Milne, formerly commander of the squadron on the British North American Station, is dangerously ill.

The Quebec steamer is now plying regularly once a week to Victoria, calling at intermediate ports in the Gulf.

The steamer Merril was to commence loading at Montreal to-day (15th) for Shelburne, Summerside, Charlottetown and Pictou.
