Having Good Sport.

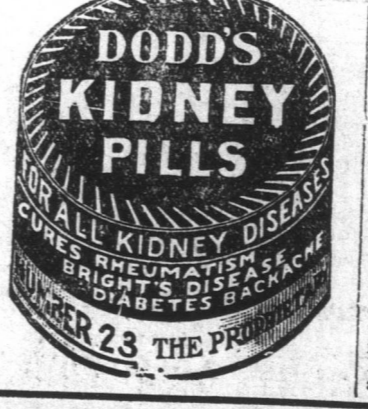
Baron von Pleissner, who is deer shooting at Millertown, telegraphs to-day to friends in the city saying that he is doing well with the deer.
