The International Congress on Tu-berculosis that met in Washington berculosis that met in Washington last winter discussed the financial side of consumption as well as its medical aspect. There were 160,000 deaths from tuberculosis in the United States last year. Probably one-half of those unfortunate people would have been alive and well today if they had taken so small a precaution as putting on a pair of rubbers every time they went out into the rain or snow,
